

2011 LSQG Quilting Challenge Stars Remembered

Rules:

The quilt must have at least three different stars. The stars must use three different techniques.

The possible techniques could be... pieced, appliquéd, hand or machine embroidery,

embellishments, hand or machine quilting. The stars must be three different sizes.

The quilt must have red, white, and blue colors showing on the front. Other colors can be added.

The finished quilt must have a finished measure not less than 30 x 30 inches and not more than 40

The finished quilt must have a finished measure not less than 30×30 inches and not more than 40×40 inches (plus or minus 1 inch).

The quilt must consist of three layers: a top, a batting layer and a backing.

The quilt must be quilted either by hand or machine.

The quilt must be finished to include binding. Hanging sleeve is not required.

The quilt must be made only by the submitting quilter, who must be a member of the Lee's Summit Quilters' Guild.

Quilts will be judged by an independent judge. Judging will be based on use of the theme of 3 different stars, 3 sizes, and 3 techniques. Also, visual impact and workmanship will be considered. Deadline for quilts will be the September 2011 meeting.

Quilts that do not meet the above guild lines will be disqualified.

- Best of Show


Cutting Instructions:


Background fabric:

Cut [1] 3-1/2" x wof strip

Sub-cut [4] 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles [E

Sub-cut [4] 3-1/2" squares [A]





From various medium to dark parts:

Cut [8] 3-1/2" squares [A]

Cut [4] 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles [C]

Note: This is a scrappy block. You may repeat your colors several times in the block; you could make all four corner triangles the same or you could make all 4 rectangles the same and all four of the inner triangles the same. I went for scrappy.


Piecing Instructions:

Draw a diagonal line on the back of each of the [A] squares, [both the print squares and the background squares] with a pencil or fine point marking pen but NOT an ink pen.



Place an [A] print square on the end of the [B] background rectangle. Sew a few threads from the drawn line towards the outside corner. Press towards the print triangle. Open the triangle back up and trim with your rotary cutter and ruler. SAVE ALL TRIANGLES YOU TRIM OFF FOR BLOCK #14.

This side will be cut away →
Sew and save for block #14



Sew a Square to the opposite end →



Press towards the triangles [or away from the background fabric].

Make 4 like this →




Place a 3-1/2" [A] background square on the right end of each of the [C] print rectangles as shown below. Be sure you have the angle going the same as the diagram below. Stitch just a couple of thread widths off the drawn line and on the side that will be cut off. They should measure 3-1/2" x 6-1/2".

This side will be cut away → Save and sew for block #14



Make 4 like this →



At this time I suggest you sew the triangles pieces together into half square triangles and set aside for block #14.

Lay your units out like the diagram. Sew together into pairs.

Press towards the print rectangle →

Sew these four units together into pairs, and then

sew the pairs together. Press either direction.

Your block should measure 12-1/2".

Cutting Instructions:

Background fabric:

Cut [1] 4-1/2" square [C]

[Note: If you to use this for a signature

Block, use a light print so your writing will show.]

Cut [4] 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles [B]

Various prints:

Cut [4] 2-1/2" squares for the corner units of the block [A]

And the [12] half square triangles [HST] [D] you saved from block #13. [See note at bottom.]

Piecing Instructions:

Pair up [8] of the HST. Press one in each pair to the background fabric and one in each pair to the print fabric. Square them up to 2-1/2" square. Do this

by laying a 6" [or 6-1/2"] square ruler on the HST with the 45 degree line following the middle line of the HST. Trim off two sides and rotate the block. Keep the 45 degree line in the middle of the HST, measure it to 2-1/2" and trim off the excess on the remaining two sides. To keep the HST even, *you must center* the diagonal line from your ruler on your HST.

Press the remaining four HST to the print fabric. Square these up to 2-1/2" as well.

Place the pair of HST together so they are mirror images. The seams should "nest" together because we pressed them opposite. Sew together along the background edge.

They should look like this →

Press either direction. Make 4.


Sew one of the above units on each side of the center 4-1/2" square. Press towards the middle square.


Sew a HST on each end of the remaining pairs of HST.

Press away from the middle pair of HST.

Sew these on the remaining two sides of the middle square.

Press toward the center square.






Sew a background rectangle on each side of the block center. Press towards the rectangle.

Sew a 2-1/2" square on each end of the remaining background 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles.

Press towards the rectangle.


Sew to block. Press away from the center.

Your block should measure 12-1/2".



Note: If you do not want to use your left over triangles from block #13, Cut [6] 2-7/8" square of background fabric and [6] squares of print fabric.

Cut both on the diagonal, pair up prints with background and sew together. They should measure 2-1/2" square
