President Donna Bland called the meeting to order at 9:04 am. Minutes of the February 11, 2013 were approved as published.

Old Business: Nothing

Tiki helps veterans adjust with their returning life after serving their country and assists with any material items they might need. She has requested the guild make child size or twin quilts for them. Tiki is also accepting donations for the thrift shop.

Next month is yellow, soft yellows for pastels, gold's for civil war or yellow batiks. <u>Pastels:</u> should be soft colors. No bright. In July, we will again use neutrals, in place of black. In May, purple is the

color, such as lavender. <u>Bright</u>:we will swap neutral for brown again. <u>Batiks</u>: please make sure the batik you are turning in is truly a batik, otherwise it will be returned to you.

Small: 15" of main print and 9" for ruffle and ties Medium: 19" of main print and 9" for ruffle and ties Large: 23" of main print and 12" for ruffle and ties Mom size: 1-1/4 yard of main print and 5/8 yard for ruffle and ties

We should be able to get two aprons out of 2/3 of yard but would need to double the fabric for the ruffle and ties.

Also needed for the aprons are [2] buttons size 1/2" to 3/4".

We have some buttons left from last year but not sure how "cute" they are.

Guild Projects

NICKEL SWAP UP-DATE:

April's color is Yellow. For pastels, think soft shades of yellow - they should not shout at you. For batiks or civil war they can be yellow to gold for batiks and golds for civil war. For brights, bright vivid yellows.

I have had several questions on the browns and blacks for the pastels and brights. Clarifications and adjustments listed below:

For **pastels**, browns can be a soft tan and you can also go with a light background with a tan/beige print. If you cannot find anything, substitute with a neutral color.

For **pastels**, on the black you can go with gray. Again if you cannot find something you like, go with a neutral as we will probably need more neutrals to complete a project.

On **brights**, if you cannot find a brown or black you can substitute with another neutral. A neutral can does not have to be beige or white, it could be a light color. A black can be a black background with a print of any bright color on it. The same for brown.

UFO CHALLENGE:

New members can join the challenge. See Nancy for the info or go to the blog and click on guild projects <u>www.lsqg.blogspot.com</u>

There will be just one minor adjustment. You only need to fill out the form for up to the number of months left in this years guild year. [Ends in September]

So if you joined in February or March, you can fill the form out with up to 6 projects you want to complete this year. The item needs to be quilt show ready. The guidelines for the challenge are also on our blog and are listed under guild projects. You can list from one to six items but no more. You do not have to list more than one if you do not want to. There is a monthly drawing for a door prize at the end of the UFO show and tells.

FIRST QUILT AND/OR UGLY QUILT:

For our September program we will have show and tell for our "First Quilt and/or Ugly Quilt. If you have one for each you may bring both for show and tell. I am going to try to borrow the baby quilt from my daughter that I made her as she still has it. And I have what I would consider an ugly guilt - it still needs the binding.
