The regular meeting of the Lee's Summit Quilters' Guild was called to order by President Pam Dooley at 9:00 a.m. on July 11, 2011 at Woods Chapel United Methodist Church with 93 members and seven guests present.

Old Business:

The minutes of the June guild meeting was approved as written. The treasurer's report for June was approved and filed for audit.

Pam Dooley reminded us that the church had allowed us to hold our July meeting in its usual place only if we helped clean it up for Vacation Bible School (VBS) afterwards. As it turned out, the only work we were requested to do was to put the chairs away.

Pam Dooley also announced that she had entered a photo from the post-June meeting's Sew Day in a *McCall's Magazine's* contest for groups making charity quilts. The prize is 35 quilting books by Martindale. Anyone interested in seeing all the entries for this contest can go to the magazine's website and click on the "Share the Warmth" tab.

Our completed Resolution Quilts and Ugly Fat Quarter Quilts will be shown at our September meeting, so please remember to finish them.

The charity table currently has lots of quilt tops and kits for our various projects for interested members to work on. Also, cookbooks are still available for \$10 each; Pam Dooley mentioned that the cookbooks make great thank-you gifts.

New members may pick up their directories from Georgene Jurgensen at the Welcome Table.

Our guild's day at the State Fair is Friday, August 12th. We will be showing your vintage or antique quilts in the Home Economics Building from 12:30 p.m. until 1:30 p.m. Your treasured quilts will be handled and watched with the utmost care. Please register your quilt by August 1st and give your quilt to JoAnn Hudson by the August 8th meeting.

New Business:

Elly Gray and Klonda Holt presented the Nominating Committee's slate of officers for next year. There was one change from the previous list because Peggy Bass felt she lives too far away to be historian. (It is difficult to impossible for her to drive the long distance here through a lot of snow or other inclement weather.) Janice Crance agreed to be nominated in Peggy's place. There were no new nominations from the floor.

The guild's Executive Board elected for next year is: President Pam Dooley; Vice-Presidents 2011-2012 Georgia Stull and Sharon Neuer; Recording Secretary Mary Lou Pick; Correspondence Secretary Becky Kempf; Treasurer Betty Willeke; Historian Janice Crance; Newsletter Editor Diane Cox; Ways and Means Director Jan Hoffman; and 2012 Quilt Show Chairs Judy Sewell and Elaine Boten.

Thank you, new nominees, for agreeing to serve. And a huge thank you goes to Elly Gray and Klonda Holt for all their hard work on the Nominating Committee.

Committee Reports:

Membership: Our three guests were Cheryl Hunker, Carole Lindgren, and Lois Rupp. We also had seven new members join; they are Cheri Rabourn, Robert Brents, Barbara Gustin, Carol Netter, Marylou Cramsey, and Carole Lindgren.

Programs: Donna Bland reminded us that today's program was Susan Cleveland's lecture and trunk show on Piping Hot Binding. Susan's Piping Hot Binding workshop was scheduled for Tuesday, July 12th at the church.

Our August program will be Deanna Hodges's lecture and trunk show. She comes from the quilt store in Eudora, KS. After Deanna's presentation, she will be holding an afternoon workshop on wool appliqué. Diane Cox has the sign-up sheet. Participants will need DMC floss, which Diane has available.

The suggested project for the July Bee on the fourth Wednesday (the 27th) at the Duck Pond will be a quilt-as-you-go quilt. Please bring any 80/20 or 100 percent cotton batting scraps you might have.

Quilt Show 2011: Sharon Neuer showed us the new Quilt Show 2011 bookmarks which she asked us to give out to people who might be interested. Next month she will be handing out kits for us to work on. Also, Teresa Steele will be our quilt show's Featured Quilter this year. Sharon also announced that the quilt show has been receiving a great deal of print publicity locally. Janice Crance asked us to make bags and pillow cases for the Boutique. She would also like us to make quilter caddies, such as the one she showed, at the Bees. In addition, Janice will begin collecting donations of gently used magazines and books in September. Cheryl Gross reminded us that Challenge Quilts are due in September. (The instructions are on the blog.)

Diane Cox requested us to register our quilts for the Quilt Show online (preferred) or by hard copy. The strict deadline for entries will be September 30th.

Pam Dooley announced that Moda has given us blanket approval to sell items made from Moda patterns in the Boutique as long as the patterns receive just credit.

Beth Kurzava urged us to push on to prepare for the 2011 Quilt Show.

PLEASE MAKE ITEMS FOR THE BOUTIQUE!

Ways and Means: Jan Hoffman reminded us that the drawing for the Opportunity Quilt will be held in September. She asked that everyone finish selling tickets for the Opportunity Quilt; the tickets are one ticket for \$1 or six tickets for \$5.

Jan has sign-up sheets for the quilt bags which will cost \$6 per bag. She needs the information, so she can send in the orders. The color choices are all bright in order to be visible; you may choose amongst pink, lime green, cobalt blue, and violet.

Guild Projects and Round Robins: Nancy Solsberg reminded us that the Round Robin and Round Row projects will be shown next month. The blocks or rows need only to be pinned to muslin for that meeting.

The next mystery quilt will have directions for two sizes: lap and bed. The instructions for a sample Rail Fence quilt appear in the newsletter.

June's winners(?) of the Round Tufts showed their projects. Nadine Trollinger completed a small quilt she had begun working on in 1999 or so. Nancy Solsberg finished a bed-size quilt she had started in 2005. Then Nadine and Nancy tossed their Round Tufts. The lucky recipients should bring their projects to the August meeting.

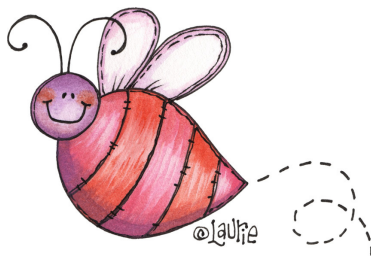

LSQG 2011 QUILT SHOW REGISTRATION

We will be registering quilts online as we did last year. For those who do not do internet, paper copies will be available for you to fill out. If you go to the blog www.Lsqq.blogspot.com and click on "2011 Quilt Show" (which is on the right hand side), this will take you to the online registration form. If you want a paper copy, I will have them at Guild meetings and the Bees. The deadline for registration is September 30th. This gives everyone a good deal of time to get your projects done and entered into the Show!

Information for those who are not familiar with entering your items into the Quilt Show: Once you have registered your items, I will make a label that will be displayed with your item while it hangs in the quilt show. You will bring your registered items to the church Gym (north side of the building) on November 3rd to have them "checked in". As we get closer to the quilt show date, an exact time will be given. It will probably be late in the afternoon. You will be given a claim check that has all your items listed on it. This claim check is for you to keep and turn in when you pick up your items Saturday evening, November 5th. Once again, closer to the quilt show date, an exact "pick up" time will be given. The show closes at 5:00 on the 5th. We will allow enough time for the quilt show to be taken down and frames loaded up in the trailer before any quilts are picked up. Please plan on putting your items in the show! This is a great opportunity for our Guild to display the wonderful talents of all our members to the community!

 - Large (Queen 84x92; King 100x92)
- Art Innovative
- Wearables, Misc.
- Best Hand Quilting
- Best Machine Quilting
- Best of Show

As we move through the year toward the quilt show, LSQG members will be asked to participate in making items for the Boutique, distributing publicity bookmarks and fliers, and other projects. We'll also have sign-up sheets available for members to volunteer a couple hours of time to setup, take down, or work during the quilt show and/or to donate food for the volunteers and vendors.
