Programs: <u>December:</u> Christmas party. <u>Bookmarks:</u> Bookmarks are available on the Greeting Table with the programs listed. <u>June:</u> Dixie Mothersbaugh's daughter, who was a winner at the Houston Quilt Show, will present a program to the Guild in June.

Quilt Show 2014: Cheryl Gross/Becky Kempf- Thank you to all who helped and attended. There were 793 paid admissions, 118 Guild members, plus other helpers for a total attendance of 972 people. This was about the same as last year. The Silent Auction had 39 items and made over \$1,000. The basket at the raffle was won by Terri Budzinski; the iron by Karen Pylman. The jar in the Guild Corner had 229 spools and was won by Toni Anderson. The Bed Turning had 18 quilts. The Boutique raised \$3,350 as of now, but will be selling items at the break. The award winners shared their prize-winning quilts.

Guild Projects: Sharon Neuer/Georgene Jurgensen- Strip Exchange: The strips will be returned in December. The bag class costs \$5.00 and will be after the January meeting in the Lecture Hall. Sign up with Guild Projects- Nancy Solsberg. You may bring your own strips if you did not participate in the exchange. The cording is 3/8" poly cotton cording for \$1 a yard at JoAnn's, or you can make your own with a 1/2" strip of fabric. Check your supply list for details.

<u>The UFO Challenge</u> first four-month period will be January through April. Members can turn in their forms at the December and January meetings. For one quilt that is completed each month, your name will go in a drawing for the end of the four-month period.

The Mystery Quilt will be announced in January and will begin in February. It will be available in 3 sizes.

<u>Tip of the month:</u> Pop off the bottom end of a smaller Gutermann or similar spool to insert into a spool with a large opening to prevent wobbling and get more even tension.

Guild Outreach: Vickie Gordon/Martha Lear/Jolene Johnson- <u>Cancer Quilts:</u> There has been a great response to the subway tile pattern. Several completed tops were shared. Members were reminded that there are 3 ways to have their names entered into the drawing: 1. Complete a quilt top using a kit or on your own about 47 x 66; 2. Quilt a quilt (backing and batting is provided) on your longarm or home machine; 3. Bind the quilt. <u>We Care About You Bags:</u> These simple drawstring bags will be given to children who are removed from their homes in emergency situations and will be distributed by the Missouri Division of Family Services. They require 1 yard of fabric.

Beekeeper: Peggy Patterson- A Bee is where we get together and sew on personal or Guild projects. The next Bee will be Monday, November 17th, at the Duck Pond at Raintree. The building will be open from 9-4. Cutting mats, irons, and ironing boards are provided. You will need to bring your own cutters and rulers. There is a link on the Blog to a map.

Christmas Party: Donna Bland- There will be a Guild Christmas Party next month after the regular meeting. We will have a regular meeting at 9:00 a.m. in the Worship Center, then dismiss to the Foyer for light refreshments. Beverages will be coffee, tea, and water. There will be an optional gift exchange of a \$15 sewing/quilting item. Everyone will get to participate in door prizes provided by the Guild.

Thanks to everyone who participated in the 2.5 inch strip swap in. You will get your strips back at the December meeting.

We have over 40 members planned for the January class to make **Quilt Carry Bags**. Can't wait to see them all at the guild booth at the next quilt show. You need to plan on getting your lining, batting and strips prepped before the class. The meeting room upstairs at the church will be used and don't forget your lunch. Class starts about 1/2 hour after our January meeting.

UFO Challenge is ON!!!! Sign up still available. You can sign up for 4 months at a time. If you want one project in the first challenge and one project in the second that's great. No more than 8 total. Form is attached, turn in at the December meeting. Your name will be included for a great prize for each completed project. Show your completed items starting in January.



QUILT CARRY BAG SUPPLY LIST

26 Strips (width of Fabric), 2.5" wide
52" x 33" Fabric for lining (muslin is fine) plus 3 - 2.5 inch strips for strap lining
52" x 33" batting
2 lengths of cord each approximately 60" long
Optional:
3 yds of 2 to 4" wide strapping
Velcro or snaps or buttons and pony tail ties

Prior to Class:

Preparing the quilt lining and batting: Use one of 2 methods to secure together. One – spray baste or Two - pin baste them together. If pin basting be sure and pin on the batting side for easy removal. On the long sides sew a basting seam about $\frac{1}{4}$ inch from edge. This will hold your edges together and keep the lining and batting square as you add the strips.

If you are not doing the strip exchange prepare your strips by cutting to 35 inches in length after removing salvage. Save the excess you cut off – we will use that for the handles.

Sewing machine in good working order, and other sewing supplies. Walking foot is helpful, any quilting ruler larger than 6" long, Plus a small cutting mat and rotary cutter for trimming strips.

OUTREACH

Pattern for Subway Tile Lap Quilt

Large blocks are 6 x 10", cut 54

Small or end blocks are 5 1/4 x 6", cut 12

Use 6 or more different fabrics. Sort blocks to make a scrappy look.

Row 1 and all uneven rows (1,3,5 etc.) are 5 large blocks sewn end to end on the short side.

Row 2 and all even rows (2,4,6 etc.) begin and end with a small block with 4 large blocks between.

Sew 12 rows together. No Matching Seams. Makes a 47 x 66" top.
