January after the meeting, we will start the class for our quilt carry bags. Be sure to bring your supplies and a lunch. (also a long extension cord) We will use the meeting room upstairs. The supply list and the pre-class prep is attached here and also this will be on the blog site on the left under guild projects.

Starting in January bring in your UFO's for showing and surprises. Hopefully we will see some of these quilts in next year's quilt show.

Also, announced in January our mystery quilt challenge. Fabric requirements, strip cutting and first step will be announced. This quilt has no triangles and will be fun for beginners and those with more experience. It is a STASH BUSTER...... All instructions and steps will be posted monthly on the blog site. Click on the left side of the web page, under Guild Projects. All of our events will be listed there all year for your convenience.

QUILT CARRY BAG ---- SUPPLY LIST

26 Strips (width of Fabric), 2.5" wide
52" x 33" Fabric for lining (muslin is fine) plus 3 - 2.5 inch strips for strap lining
52" x 33" batting
2 lengths of cord each approximately 60" long
Optional:
3 yds of 2 to 4" wide strapping
Velcro or snaps or buttons and pony tail ties

Prior to Class:

Preparing the quilt lining and batting: Use one of 2 methods to secure together. One – spray baste or Two - pin baste them together. If pin basting be sure and pin on the batting side for easy removal. On the long sides sew a basting seam about ¼ inch from edge. This will hold your edges together and keep the lining and batting square as you add the strips.

If you are not doing the strip exchange prepare your strips by cutting to 35 inches in length after removing salvage. Save the excess you cut off – we will use that for the handles.

Sewing machine in good working order, and other sewing supplies. Walking foot is helpful, any quilting ruler larger than 6" long, Plus a small cutting mat and rotary cutter for trimming strips.

Everything Old is New Again by Rose Cottage Quilts

The program for March 2015 is Deanna Hodson, of Rose Cottage Quilts. She will present a lecture/power point on "Everything Old is New Again". On Monday, after our guild meeting and program, Deanna will be doing a ½ day workshop that features Deb Tucker rulers. The Workshop is Blazing Lemoyne Basket. It can be made with Lemoyne Triangles or Wool Applique. We will have pictures at guild. Rose Cottage Quilts will have wool kits available for the applique at \$7.50 for [6] 4" squares. A handout will be given to you when you sign up and pay for the class.

The cost of this ½ day workshop is \$20.00 plus \$10.00 for the pattern. The ruler needed for the workshop is the Rapid Fire Lemoyne Star Ruler and the Tucker Trimmer III is optional. Ways and Means will be working with programs in ordering these rulers. A blast will be sent out before the January meeting with prices.

On Tuesday, March 10 from 9 a.m. to 3:30 [4:00 p.m.] we will have a 6 hour workshop by Rose Cottage Quilts on "Vintage Linen Crazy Quilt". This quilt is designed using your vintage handkerchiefs. This workshop is \$40.00 plus \$10.00 for the pattern. Patterns will be available at sign up. A list of what you need to have prepared will be handed out upon payment. Also available is a small bag of "Vintage Textile Wash" at \$3.75 a bag for washing your vintage hankies.

The Blazing Lemoyne Basket workshop will be limited to 25 and the Vintage Linen Crazy Quilt workshop will be limited to 15 so be sure to sign up and pay for your spot. Nancy took signups this month so be sure to stop by and pay for your workshops at the January meeting.

Tall Oaks Retreat 2015 dates 1st session (weekend) March 20 – 23 F, Sa, Su, M 2nd session (weekday) March 23 – 26 M, Tu, W, Th The 4th deposit is due at the January meeting. One session is 70.00 deposit; Two sessions is 140.00 deposit. There will be one more final payment due the first day of the March Retreat. It should be no more than 20.00, but we will have an exact amount due at that time.
