It is held at the Raintree Duck Pond Activity Building, 111 SW Cole Younger Dr., Lee's Summit. Parking is available by the building and on the street. The kitchen is equipped with a refrigerator, ice maker, microwave, coffee and coffee maker. The main room has lots of tables with chairs so that there is adequate space for working. Ironing boards, irons and cutting tables are provided. Pack a lunch or grab something at nearby restaurants. Doors are unlocked at 9 a.m. and we must be out by 4 p.m. Come join us for a fun time with other stitchers.

Beatle Bag Workshop is after the November meeting. We will be in the big room upstairs. Please bring your lunch. We will take a short break after the Guild meeting for lunch.

Please have everything cut out before the workshop. The next step we would like you to have done is the quilting on the 2 large pieces. These are the 12" x 21" pieces. The outside is quilted to one piece of Soft and Stable and the inside is quilted to the 2nd piece of Soft and Stable. The inside will be covered up with pockets, pin cushion, etc. so you can keep the quilting simple.

Please be sure to bring your ring and crushed walnuts, along with your sewing machine, size 14 needles, a walking foot if you have one [optional], matching thread, ruler for measuring, pins and marking pen or pencil.

Lee's Summit Quilters' Guild Minutes of the Meeting of the General Membership October 13, 2014

The meeting was called to order by President Cheryl Gross at 9:02 AM.

The minutes from the previous meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

The budget report from the last meeting was approved and filed for audit.

Old Business: Membership dues: Members with paid-up dues will get into the Quilt Show free.

Greeting Table: Please be sure to sign in at the meetings. If there is a long line, feel free to get your seat and come back a little later to sign in.

New Business: <u>Budget:</u> A copy of the new budget was sent in a Blast to the members. The line item for the Christmas party was questioned so it was recommended that it not be included pending further review at a Board meeting on October 20th. A motion for approval of the budget presented with further review of the line item for the Christmas party was made by Elly Gray and seconded by Georgene Jurgensen. The vote was taken by a show of hands and the motion passed. The new budget was approved.

Committee Reports:

Corresponding Secretary: Jan Hoffman- Jan was not at the meeting but sent word that a card had been sent to Janie Wagner for the death of her husband.

Guild Projects: Sharon Neuer/Georgene Jurgensen- Plans for the next year include a mystery quilt starting in January lasting for 4-5 months, a round robin, and a challenge which will be done in time for the Quilt Show next year.

<u>The UFO Challenge</u> will continue, but you can sign up for either a whole year or 4 months at a time. You will only get credit for one quilt a month for your name to be entered for a prize drawing at the end of the 4 month period. The forms are on the Blog. Sign up in November and December to start in January.

<u>Strip Exchange:</u> This is for the November meeting. Put 26 strips in a baggy with your name. No more than 2 strips of any fabric - 2 1/2" X wof. There will be a workshop after the January meeting to use your strips to make a bag. Sign-ups are October and November. The workshop costs \$5.00 and will take place upstairs in the Lecture Hall.

Programs: Joan Gardner/Nancy Solsberg- <u>November:</u> JoAnn Webb of Blue Springs, an AQS Award winner for best hand work. She will bring quilts and fabric. There will be a Beetle Bag workshop after meeting. The workshop is full, but you can be on a waiting list. Please have everything cut out before the workshop.

Beekeeper: Peggy Patterson- There will be a Bee Monday, October 20th, at the Duck Pond at Raintree. Cutting mats, irons, and ironing boards are provided. The building will be open from 9-4. There is a link on the Blog to a map.

Guild Outreach: Vickie Gordon- Martha Lear, Jo Ann Johnson, and Jolene Johnson were introduced as the other members of the committee. <u>Cancer Quilts:</u> Making lap quilts for the Cancer Center will continue as an outreach project. Vickie delivered 24 quilts last week. The pattern this year will be 6 x 10 subway tile blocks which finish into a top approximately 47 x 65. Members who complete a top, do the quilting (Guild will provide the batting), or bind a quilt will have their names entered into a drawing. <u>Free Table:</u> The Free Table will continue with Outreach members sorting items the first half of the meeting. The table will be open to members at the break.

Ways & Means: Jan Campbell/Phyllis Buck- There are plans for a Guild cookbook, so mark your best recipes as you're cooking for the holidays.

2014 Quilt Show: Cheryl Gross/Becky Kempf- There are only 10 days until the Quilt Show. Volunteers are still needed, so be sure to sign up.

Appraisals: See Becky Kempf- There are still openings.

<u>Bed Turning:</u> Chris Pembrook- We still need some older quilts. This is the last day for forms to be returned.

<u>Boutique:</u> Jessie Harvey/Connie Gross- Shared completed items. Reminded the members to bring magazines and books. They are still accepting items for the Boutique.

<u>Silent Auction:</u> Jo Ann Hudson- Each person bidding will be assigned a number and will use that number when bidding. Out of town customers will be able to take their purchases if they buy-it-now, but Guild members will be asked to wait until the close of the show.

<u>Volunteer Sign up:</u> Mary Lou Pick/Sheryl Murray- There are still openings for volunteers in most areas. Jobs can be standing, walking, or sitting. Workers are asked to arrive 15 minutes early for their shifts for a smoother transition. Be sure to go the the Volunteer table to sign in and get an apron. <u>Ballots:</u> The cut off for the ballots will be noon on Saturday which will allow time to showcase the winners.

OUTREACH

Pattern for Subway Tile Lap Quilt

Large blocks are 6 x 10", cut 54

Small or end blocks are 5 1/4 x 6", cut 12

Use 6 or more different fabrics. Sort blocks to make a scrappy look.

Row 1 and all uneven rows (1,3,5 etc.) are 5 large blocks sewn end to end on the short side.

Row 2 and all even rows (2,4,6 etc.) begin and end with a small block with 4 large blocks between.

Sew 12 rows together. No Matching Seams. Makes a 47 x 66" top.

To participate just bring in 26 - 2.5 inch strips cut the full width of fabric. Make it scrappy with no more than 2 strips of any one fabric. Put in a plastic bag with your name on it and drop in the basket at the Guild Projects table in November. Strips will be sorted and returned to you. YOU DO NOT have to participate in the quilt carry bag workshop to do the strip exchange. Just a fun way to get some new fabrics for your next project.

QUILT CARRY BAG SUPPLY LIST

26 Strips (width of Fabric), 2.5" wide

52" x 33" Fabric for lining (muslin is fine) plus 3 - 2.5 inch strips for strap lining

52" x 33" batting

2 lengths of cord each approximately 60" long

Optional:

3 yds of 2 to 4" wide strapping

Velcro or snaps or buttons and pony tail ties

Prior to Class:

Preparing the quilt lining and batting: Use one of 2 methods to secure together. One – spray baste or Two – pin baste them together. If pin basting be sure and pin on the batting side for easy removal. On the long sides sew a basting seam about $\frac{1}{4}$ inch from edge. This will hold your edges together and keep the lining and batting square as you add the strips.

If you are not doing the strip exchange prepare your strips by cutting to 35 inches in length after removing salvage. Save the excess you cut off - we will use that for the handles.

Sewing machine in good working order, and other sewing supplies. Walking foot is helpful, any quilting ruler larger than 6" long, Plus a small cutting mat and rotary cutter for trimming strips.
