## Stories in Stitches

Quilts from the Cass County Quilt Documentation Project

As quilters, we know that every quilt tells a story. It tells the story of, not only how it was constructed and when, but it also tells the story of who made it and why. In 2010, Jenifer along with three other women joined force to organize a quilt documentation project in Cass County, Mo. Their goal was to gather as many quilts and stories together as possible to preserve the history and beauty of these quilts.

More than 100 quilted treasures have been documented since the project started. Some came out of linen closets, others came from boxes in the attic and some left their homes for the first time ever to be documented. The stories these quilts tell reveal the larger story of their community and the times in which they were made.

Join Jenifer in October and see a sampling of these quilts and hear their stories. In addition, Jenifer is asking members to bring in one of their quilted treasures – a quilt more than 50 years old. This may be a family heirloom that you want to show off to the guild or it may be a quilt you own but don't know much about but would like to learn more. She's asking for only about 15 quilts, so please contact her ahead of time to sign up to show your quilt.

The regular meeting of the Lee's Summit Quilters Guild was called to order by President Pam Dooley at 9:02 a.m. on September 10, 2012 at Woods Chapel United Methodist Church with 93 members and seven guests present.

#### **Old Business:**

The treasurer's report for August was approved and filed for audit. The minutes of the August guild meeting were approved as written.

Our December meeting will be the annual Christmas luncheon. The luncheon will cost each member \$6.50 (with the guild subsidizing \$5 per member). Sign up by the guild meeting in October.

#### **New Business:**

We had seven guests: Paula Gilmore; Jane Colster; Jane Alvested; Milda Lewis; Kathy Leslie; Mary Ann Lanoue; and Alice Boortz. Our new members are Carol Antal and Paula Gilmore. Welcome to you all!

Annual guild dues of \$30 are due by the guild meeting in October.

A thank-you note was sent to Elaine Boten's mother. She made the painted gourds which sold out at the quilt show meeting. KCPT sent the guild an art quilt book to thank us for our \$100 donation.

The Brents family sent a note of appreciation for the card we sent when their mother died. Elly Gray's husband is in the hospital.

The Twilight Stitchers Quilt Guild will hold its annual quilt show at the Lutheran Church in Blue Springs next weekend. The Starlight Quilt Guild will hold its quilt show on October 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> in the VFW Hall in Lenexa. Admission will be \$3 per person, except veterans with military ID will have free admission to the show.

There was cake in the hall in honor of Mary Mashburn's birthday. Jolene Johnson and Sue Williams also had their birthdays today.

There are plenty of Donation Quilt kits available now.

### **Committee Reports:**

**Programs:** Candy Hargrove was today's guest speaker with her trunk show, "I'm a Quilt Designer—You Are, Too." Candy held her Harvest Jumble Quilt workshop in the afternoon.

In October, guild member Jenifer Dick will present a trunk show for the program. She asks if anyone has a family heirloom to show to please let her know ahead of time.

In November, our program will be Quilt College and a pizza party. Quilt College is an annual program with members presenting five or six technique demonstrations. We may have donation quilt sewing in the afternoon following the pizza party.

**Quilt Show 2011:** Remember that the Quilt Show will be on Friday, November 2<sup>nd</sup> and Saturday, November 3<sup>rd</sup> (i.e., less than two months away). The Worship Center will hold only quilts. The vendors and guild activities will be in the adjacent halls.

Pam Dooley would like to receive all donations of handcrafted items, gently used books and magazines, never-used notions, fat quarters or charm squares, UFOs, and orphan blocks by the October meeting. She needs time to price the donations.

Our Quilt Show is sharing publicity expenses with the Blue Valley Quilt Guild show, but the shows will be separate. Their show will be at the Shawnee Civic Center. The admission to our show will be \$3; and the admission to the Blue Valley show will also be \$3. Postcards with the information about both shows are available for members of our guild to hand out to whomever you might think would be interested.

Silent Auction still needs holiday table runners and wall hangings.

Pat Wheeler has applications for antique or interesting quilts for the Quilt Show's Bed Turning. You can also telephone or email Pat to register your antique quilt. Pat's telephone number was misprinted in the directory. It is actually 816-268-4271. The deadline for entering a quilt in the Bed Turning is our October meeting.

Elly Gray and Sue Williams are in charge of Hospitality at the Quilt Show. Please sign up with them either to: (1) bring food during the Quilt Show for the guild members working at the show and vendors; or (2) donate money to help buy food for such a purpose.

Diane Cox is in charge of registering your quilt(s) for the show. There is an online form on the blog and paper copies are available at our meetings. If the blog is unavailable to you, paper forms are available. Only 70 quilts have been registered so far. The deadline for registration is September 30<sup>th</sup>. Guild Corner need finished projects or quilt tops from our workshops or completed charity projects to show.

Mary Lou Pick reminded members that volunteers are necessary in order for the Quilt Show to succeed. She has sign-up sheets available at the meeting, or you can telephone or email her between meetings. Each member should try to sign up to work at least one two-hour shift. Jobs, such as Greeting Table and Silent Auction, are available for those who find it difficult to stand for long periods. Boutique and Guild Corner are jobs involving mostly sitting. Viewer's Choice, which involves tallying up the public's votes, is also mostly sitting.

White Gloves needs lots of workers.

If you sign up with Mary Lou Pick to work at Hospitality, your job will include tasks such as making coffee, handling trash, and replacing food as it is eaten.

Signage involves setting the Quilt Show signs before the show and taking them down afterwards. Members of the Prize Patrol will sell tickets for the opportunity baskets. Floaters will pick up any slack as needed. Floaters probably ought to bring some handwork with them in case they have downtime.

Plenty of opportunities to work are still available, and you probably can still get your first choice in time slots.

**Guild Projects and Round Robins:** This month was the last month for the 2-1/2 inch wide strip exchange is winding down. Nancy Solsberg showed a scrappy Trip Around the World quilt block. However, they will then get their opportunities to toss the Round Tuits to someone else. Also, if you receive a Tuit, you can choose to pass it along to someone else.

Gayle Hawley showed the miniature hand-quilted quilt she completed.

Nancy Solsberg finished binding three quilts which had been waiting to be completed for a long time. Dalene Philpott presented her own quilt show of completed project.

Next month's Round Tuit project presenters will be Sharon Neuer, Jessie Harvey, Donna Bland, and Janice Campbell.

The Ugly Fat Quarter Challenge projects were presented. Marylou Cramsey made a circle within an on-point square charity quilt. Diane Cox showed her lattice-work quilt. Georgene Jurgensen made bags to sell at Boutique. Mary Eubanks decorated towels, made table toppers, and used another fat quarter for a quilt label for another quilt. Jill Dean made a small Log Cabin quilt. Lora Meadows made placemats.

Nancy Solsberg announced some possibilities for next year's guild projects. One is a BOM with blocks with twilling, embroidery, or appliqués alternated with pieced blocks. Another possibility is a fabric exchange. There also might be a UFO project.

Her first Executive Board meeting will be on Monday, October 1<sup>st</sup> at 9:00 a.m. at the Duck Pond.
