Workshop: Charm Party Tote 1-4pm – all skill levels

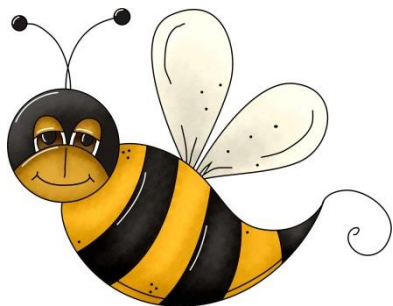
