Lee's Summit Quilters' Guild Minutes of the General Membership, August 13, 2012

The regular meeting of the Lee's Summit Quilters' Guild was called to order by President Pam Dooley at 9:05 a.m. on August 13, 2012 at Woods Chapel United Methodist Church with 107 members and two guests present.

Old Business:

The treasurer's report for July was approved and filed for audit. The minutes of the July guild meeting were approved as written.

Pam Dooley thanked JoAnn Hudson for her wonderful job managing our exhibit of prize-winning quilts at the Missouri State Fair. Cheri Rouborn and Patty Rhoades both won ribbons for their quilts at the State Fair.

Joy O'Kane has several new books ready for check-out in the guild library.

Juanita Brents's mother died last month after a long illness.

Pam Dooley announced that notices of area quilt shows will soon be posted on the blog.

Pam Dooley also received donations of two pairs of slippers and would like to know whether the donor intended them for the Boutique or for the Pink Slipper project.

New Business:

We had two guests, Dani Bunting and Christina Erickson, and no new members.

Peggy Patterson has flyers for the Springfield quilt show and can sell you a ticket to said show.

Beth Kurzava's shop will start offering classes next month.

Donna Bland led a group who made seasonal items for Hillcrest House's auction in November.

Hillcrest House is one of Woods Chapel United Methodist Church's charities. Any more donations of seasonal items for the auction would be appreciated.

Pam Dooley showed examples of placemats we can make for our new charity beginning in January.

The placemats will be delivered with meals to shut-ins.

Committee Reports:

Programs: Candy Hargrove will present her trunk show, "I'm a Quilt Designer—You Are, Too," at our meeting in September. Candy will hold a Harvest Jumble Quilt workshop in the afternoon. There are still spaces available for the workshop for \$25 each.

In October, guild member Jenifer Dick will present the program.

Quilt Show 2011: Remember that the Quilt Show will be on Friday, November 2nd and Saturday, November 3rd. The Worship Center will hold only quilts. The vendors and guild activities will be in the adjacent halls.

Pat Wheeler has applications for antique or interesting quilts for the Quilt Show's Bed Turning. You can also telephone or email Pat to register your antique quilt. The deadline for entering a quilt in the Bed Turning is our October meeting.

Elly Gray and Sue Williams are in charge of Hospitality at the Quilt Show. Please sign up with them either to: (1) bring food during the Quilt Show for the guild members working at the show and vendors; or (2) donate money to help buy food for such a purpose.

Diane Cox is in charge of registering your quilt(s) for the show. There is an online form on the blog and paper copies are available at our meetings. Only 17 quilts have been registered so far. The deadline for registration is September 30th.

Diane Cox also offered to take the best of care of your quilt(s) if you are attending the Houston Show scheduled for the same weekend and still want to enter your quilt(s) in our Quilt Show. Please do not let your trip prevent you from showing your quilt(s) at our show.

Georgia Stull needs volunteers to help with the ribbons for the Prize Patrol.

Becky Camacho has only received 15 items for the Silent Auction so far. The deadline for these donations is next month's meeting. Georgene Jurgensen has fabric available for us to make items for the Silent Auction.

Pam Dooley needs items for the Boutique, especially Christmas ornaments and things for children.

Pam is now accepting donations of magazines for the Boutique.

Mary Lou Pick reminded members that volunteers are necessary in order for the Quilt Show to succeed. She has sign-up sheets available at the meeting, or you can telephone or email her between meetings. It would be great if each member could sign up to work at least one two-hour shift.

Jobs, such as Greeting Table and Silent Auction, are available for those who find it difficult to stand for long periods. Boutique and Guild Corner are jobs involving mostly sitting. Viewer's Choice, which involves tallying up the public's votes, is also mostly sitting.

White Gloves needs lots of workers.

If you sign up with Mary Lou Pick to work at Hospitality, your job will include tasks such as making coffee, handling trash, and replacing food as it is eaten.

Signage involves setting the Quilt Show signs before the show and taking them down afterwards.

Members of the Prize Patrol will sell tickets for the opportunity baskets.

Floater will pick up any slack as needed. Floaters probably ought to bring some handwork with them in case they have downtime.

Membership: New members should pick up their guild binders if they have not yet done so. Anyone who still needs to pick up a copy of the new roster should also do so; the next updated roster will not be available until early 2013.

Donation Quilts: Georgene Jurgensen has projects and kits for members to work on at home.

Christmas Party 2012: The guild will meet in our old room upstairs in December in order to be able to use the kitchen facilities for the luncheon. The guild will subsidize each member's luncheon by \$5; the out-of-pocket cost for each member for the luncheon will be \$6.50.

Guild Projects and Round Robins: Last month's Round Tuit projects were shown and the Tuits tossed. The lucky recipients are supposed to complete one of their unfinished projects and bring it to

show next month. However, they will then get their opportunities to toss the Round Tuits to someone else.

Jill Dean finished up *at least* thirteen projects, several of them quite large, since the guild met in July! She was a one-women quilting show all by herself.

Nancy Hayob completed a reversible table runner and a small quilt top made of fabric similar in looks to the fabric her grandmother used to have.

Kay Woody made a quilt out of fabric selected by her grandson for him to tie (as per his request). Kay also finished a fall wall hanging and completed her Mystery Quilt.

Martha Lear showed the gingerbread man quilt she completed.

Next month's Round Tuit project presenters will be Nancy Solsberg, Dalene Philpott, Gayle Hawley, and Sharon Neuer.

The 2-1/2 inch wide strip exchange is winding down. Nancy Solsberg showed a scrappy Trip Around the World quilt block; the pattern for this is available on Bonnie Hunt's quiltville.com website.

Donna Bland used her patriotic strips from July to make 6-inch square nine patches. She then alternated the nine patches with neutral-colored 6-inch square blocks (from fabric she had to purchase separately). Her pattern came from the newest tutorial on Missouri Star Quilts website.

Nancy Solsberg asked members to email her with suggestions for next year's Guild Projects.

Fall Frolic: Sue Williams has sign-up sheets to bring food for the potluck lunch at Fall Frolic on Monday, September 17th. This free sew day will be from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. upstairs in the old meeting room, where we will have more space for sewing and can use the kitchen easily. Fall Frolic is also an opportunity to work on donation quilts or items for the Boutique.

Donna Bland will present a workshop at Fall Frolic on how to make an apron with your sewing machine using one man's shirt and one package of bias tape.

Ways and Means: Jan Hoffman still has cookbooks available for \$10 each.

State Fair: JoAnn Hudson thanked those who volunteered at the guild's exhibit at the State Fair. These ladies were Lucy Grimes, Pam Thomason, Teresa Steele, and Diane Cox.

- 5). **ART**
Original design or commercial pattern
- 6). **WEARABLES AND FASHION ACCESSORIES** - Includes garments, totes and purses.
