As an extra incentive for those working on the Row by Row quilt, we are going to offer a door prize at the September meeting. We will have a show and tell during Guild Projects and draw the door prize then. I will be on the lookout for a nice Fat Quarter Bundle if I can find one within my budget.

There are just a few simple rules:

- 1 - it must have at least 5 of the 6 rows in the quilt top
- 2 - it can be any size
- 3 - you can add more rows of your own if you wish, again it must have at least 5 of the 6 rows given during the guild year
- 4 - it has to be complete with borders

The top only needs to be complete. Understanding that you might need to line up your quilter, we are NOT going to make it quilt show ready. If it is quilted, all the better and it will be ready for the quilt show in October.

**2014 Quilt Show:** Cheryl Gross and Becky Kempf- The quilt show will be held Oct 24-25 which is only 73 more days. There are 35 people on the Quilt Show committee who will be needing your help, so be sure to sign up. Postcards are available to distribute for publicity.

Hospitality: Margaret Swanson & Carole Bliss- Help will be needed with donations of food, drinks, or money. Be sure to sign up to work as well.

Boutique: The Boutique is accepting donations of completed items and materials. They would like more aprons, doll clothes, and dog leashes/collars.

Bed Turning: Chris Pembroke- Quilts should be made prior to 1950. This year there will be no separate category for baby quilts. If you have a baby quilt which was made prior to 1950, you may still display it.

Entry forms are available at the Guild meetings and need to be returned to Chris Pembrook by October 13th.

Silent Auction: Small items are still needed. Members are asked to put a value on their items to help set a start price and a Buy-it-now price. They would like everything turned in by September, but will continue to take items at the October meeting.

There continues to be a need for empty spools (not wooden) for a "Guess the Number of Spools" contest in the Guild corner.

### **Categories**

It's time to be working on your entries for the quilt show. It would be great if we could get every member to have an entry in our quilt show this year! The categories are as follows:

- 1) PIECED - Size divisions will be determined by the registration committee based on the number of entries. There could be small, medium, large and extra-large divisions.
- 2) HAND APPLIQUE
- 3) MACHINE APPLIQUE
- 4) HAND EMBROIDERY
- 5) MACHINE EMBROIDERY
- 6) GROUP QUILT - The quilt must be owned by a guild member. One or more guild members must have participated in the making of the quilt top.
- 7) ART QUILT - Original design or commercial pattern
- 8) SPECIALITY ITEMS - This category includes wearables, totes, purses, home décor, fashion accessories and aprons.
- 9) BEST IN SHOW

### **Silent Auction**

Keep on stitching on your "Small Treasures" for our silent auction. Small wall hangings (24" x 24"), table runners, table toppers and other small space takers are welcomed. We hope to have 30 to 35 items to wow our quilt show attendees. Please have in mind a value to put on your item. It helps with the bidding. ### **Appraiser**

We will have an AQS certified appraiser at the quilt show this year. Her name is Carol Elmore and you can sign up for an appointment before the show if you want. ### **Registration**

Accepting registration through September 15, 2014 (Monday – the day of Fall Frolic). You can register online or via paper copy. Go to the Blog, click on the Quilt Show banner and registration is right there. I will also have paper copies at our meetings for you to pick up and fill out if you prefer.

New this year is a limit on the number of large quilts that each member can enter. Each member is limited to two quilts that have a perimeter of 275" or more. If the perimeter is less than 275" then there is no limit to the number of quilts each member enters. The reason for having to do this is because the larger quilts take up much more wall area, needing a wall to themselves. With the smaller quilts, we can usually put multiple quilts on a wall, therefore having more quilts in the show.

You will bring your registered quilts to the church (in the foyer area) on Thursday, October 23, 9:30 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. so we can get them hung in the show. Pickup your quilts after the show is taken down, around 5:00 p.m. on Saturday October 25.
